

# OCP SENIOR CREDIT FUND

Monthly Update as at April 30, 2012



## Investment Rationale and Objectives

OCP Senior Credit Fund provides Unitholders with exposure to the performance of an actively managed, diversified portfolio comprised primarily of first lien floating rate senior secured loans of non-investment grade North American issuers.

The Fund's objectives are: (i) provide Unitholders with attractive, quarterly, tax-advantaged distributions, currently targeted to be \$0.50 per annum, representing an annual yield of 5% based on the original issue price of \$10.00 per Unit; (ii) preserve capital; and (iii) generate enhanced returns through increasing cash flow to the portfolio as interest rates rise.

## Commentary

Net performance of OCP Senior Credit Fund was 1.22% and 6.65% in April and year-to-date, respectively. Economic news was mixed during the month. While first quarter earnings reported by most companies remained generally positive, there were signs of economic weakness evidenced by a lower than expected March U.S. payroll report and a slowdown in Chinese growth, along with rising European sovereign concerns. Market performance was also mixed with equity markets ending the month slightly lower, and high yield bond and loan markets ending the month higher. The CS Leveraged Loan Index, CS High Yield Bond Index, and S&P500 returned 0.78%, 1.04%, and (0.63%) in the month, respectively.

The majority of the Portfolio's senior secured loan investments contributed to performance - the result of both price appreciation and interest income. Approximately one-third of positive performance was driven by the five largest gainers, including the senior term loans of Springleaf Financial Services and Aveta Inc. Both companies accessed the capital markets - Springleaf improved its liquidity position by completing a securitization of a portion of its unencumbered loan portfolio, while Aveta refinanced its term loan after strong financial performance in 2011. There continued to be no defaults in the portfolio.

The spread of the CS Leveraged Loan Index (assuming three year average life) tightened by 12 basis points to 576 basis points in April.
